We had six shooters on two relays that endured 9-15 mph winds with 20 mph gusts. Some excellent shooting produced mediocre scores as no one's score reflected their performance level in those conditions.

6. Robert Mullan- 1/40 (B-class)

There are a few changes future matches:

1. Four Shooters who help set up and take down targets before, during, and after the match will receive a \$4 rebate on their entry fee. Set up time is 0800. If there is no one to help, then no match.

2. The entire Silhouette Range firing-line will be closed to the public during Match Operations. This is because two members of the public were spotting with their rifles at/on the target setters that were downrange setting up for the match before 0900. Many thanks to Bill Miller for addressing this situation at that moment. Also, a member of the public shot a PGC-SBRMS Ram swinger at 100M with an AR-15 during the practice period putting a hole in it.

This type of target damage is irresponsible and expensive.

3. OBI (Open Bolt Indicator) use is mandatory. These will be provided with your entry if you do not have one.

Entry \$8, 40 shots, NRA Rules utilized: 6mm or larger. No magnums belted or otherwise. (fyi, 4.5kg weight limit or 10 lb, 2 oz., no muzzle break are rules.)

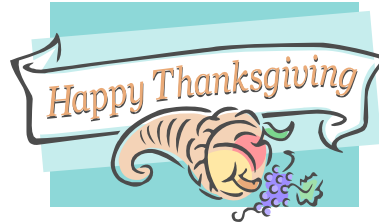
This should be an informative presentation, of interest not only us but to spouses and family members as well, and will provide an opportunity for club members to become more familiar with this important program. Please try to attend.
